The Saskatchewan Teachers' Federation in partnership with over ten community groups has undertaken a bold initiative called Re-Imagine Education, asking us to challenge our views of what education looks like today and what it could look like in the future.

The current strategic plan for education, the *Saskatchewan Plan for Growth: Vision 2020 and Beyond*, is quickly coming to an end. It has outlined some important goals, but the time has come to begin redefining a vision for the evolution of public education in our province.

A community engagement process has been developed to gather feedback on the future of education from people across the province. This feedback will be used to create a report that will have ten to twelve actionable recommendations to present to the Government of Saskatchewan early next fall – to make education a priority with government and to advocate for the changes needed.

Community members are being invited to participate in conversations around five broad themes: the purpose of education, the educated person, school community relationships, education decision making and responsibility for education in Saskatchewan.
